MORE TUNES

HORNPIPES

PRINCESS ROYAL/SAILORS HORNPIPE. The first tune is traditional and well known. The second is famous from the last night of the proms and a TV advert for Anchor butter.

CARRICK AND BIDDLESTONE HORNPIPES. A couple of 'pretty' Northumbrian hornpipes.

HARVEST HOME/BOYS OF BLUEHILL Two traditional Irish tunes

JACKY TAR/FAREWELL TO WHISKY/BALQUIDDAR LASSES. Set of hornpipes from Scotland.

MARQUIS OF LORNE From Scotland

MISS THOMPSON'S HORNPIPE Traditional English

PORTOBELLO/STEAMBOAT Two traditional tunes—the first is English the second Irish

PROUDLOCKS AND REDESDALE HORNPIPES Regularly played Northumbrian tunes

TRUMPET HORNPIPE Traditional English tune known as the theme tune to Captain Pugwash

JIGS

OYSTER GIRL/NEW RIGGED SHIP/ROSIN THE BEAU/MUCKIN O GEORDIES BYRE A lively mixed set of English, Irish and Scottish jigs

DINGLE REGATTA A well known traditional Irish jig.

THE FARANDOLES 1&2 A farandole is a French dance with similarities with a jig

BLAYDON RACES/FIVE BROKEN RIBS. The first is the ever popular Geordie tune (and song) and the second originates from Devon.

OTHER TUNES

DILL PICKLE RAG/PIG ANKLE RAG Two up beat US ragtime tunes from the early 20th C.

EL CHOCLO A well known rousing Argentine tango written in honour and taking its title from the nickname of a nightclub proprietor. Featuring Elly's fiddle

SOME CHRISTMAS TUNES

JINGLE BELLS RUDOLPH THE RED NOSED REINDEER FROSTY THE SNOWMAN WE WISH YOU A MERRY CHRISTMAS MERRY CHRISTMAS EVERYBODY

THE HAAFNETTERS

An album written and composed by Terry and Catherine and performed by The Solway Band with songs and tunes based on people and places around the Solway.

Some of the popular tracks include:

THE HAAFNETTERS The title track. A protest song 'in London they don't care for us'.

THE GREEN AND THE BLUE A song about Mark Graham, a well known Haafnet fisherman from Port Carlisle with references to Burgh marsh.

KNOX CROSS A tune named after the bend in the road between Port Carlisle and Bowness on Solway.

SOLWAY TIDES A song that has been performed most Sundays for the past 20 years and has almost become the national anthem of Bowness on Solway. Also known as 'The Coastguard Song' and 'Roger Brough's Old Haaf Net'. Now has hand and arm actions to go with it (you know something like YMCA).

SHEEP ON THE SHORE A song involving Terry and his late wife Gilly. The sheep belonged to Ernie Newman.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{TOM}}$ GOES FISHING A bluesy song. Tom Dias lived in Bowness on Solway and was a Haafnetter

WHITEIGG A tune named after Whitrigg on the other side of Bowness Moss overlooking the Wampool river.

TUNES

This is a selection of some of the tunes we play but there are many more. Most tunes have traditional or historical origins often linked with dancing and you will hear them played at Ceildihs and Barn Dances. Some tunes are played as sets of similar tunes, others are played individually.

AIRS AND WALTZES

ASHOKAN FAREWELL A modern US tune in the style of a Scottish lament and used as TV theme tune.

CRESTED HENS / ALLOA HOUSE Two waltzes—the first Irish, the second from Scotland

DARK ISLAND A haunting tune composed in 1958 and used as the theme to the BBC film of the same name. The dark island in this case was Benbecula (and not Orkney)

DREAMING A tune from Somerset

EAMOUN AN CHNOIC. This concerns Eamoun O'Riain, an Irish aristocrat who lived in County Tipperary in the 17C and became an outlaw after shooting a tax collector dead over the confiscation of a poor woman's cow

FOR IRELAND I WON'T SAY HER NAME From County Kerry

HAGGIS CAROL Actually a French Christmas carol

AIRS AND WALTZES

HUNTINGTONE CASTLE A haunting Scottish slow air

LE CANAL EN OCTOBERE / LINDEGAARDENS 8RUDEMARCH The first is a French Scottische and the second from Scandinavia

LINDISFARNE Northumbrian slow air

MARGARET'S WALTZ Sandy and Sarah waltzed along to this at their wedding (well Sandy tried to at least)

MIST COVERED MOUNTAINS OF HOME

Scottish tune dating to 1856 and recorded by Mark Knopfler as part of the Local Hero film soundtrack.

MRS HELEN ROBERTSON / MISS FORBES FAREWELL TO BANFF A Scottish slow air followed by a Scottish reel.

PLANXTY IRWIN / PLANXTY FANNY POWER Irish (O'Carolan) from mid 18th century.

ROWANTREE HILL / SWINDON Northumbrian tunes originally for smallpipes

CATHERINE AND ELEANOR'S SONGS

MY LOVE IS LIKE A RED RED ROSE A love song based on Robbie Burns 1794 poem.

RECRUITED COLLIER A mining song performed by Kate Rusby (among others) with references to Whitehaven.

SHULE AGRA A 17th century Irish song also known as 'Johnny is gone for a soldier' about a girl missing her love who has been sent to France.

SKYE 80AT SONG Scottish folk song recalling the escape of Bonnie Prince Charlie from Uist to the Isle of Skye after defeat at the Battle of Culloden

SPANCIL HILL Traditional Irish song about Irish immigrants to the USA longing for their homeland recorded by The Dubliners, The Coors, Christy Moore amongst others.

YE TACOBITES BY NAME A Scottish folk song which goes back to the Jacobite Risings

ONLY REMEMBERED In memory of those who fell in the great war

THE PARTING GLASS A traditional Scottish song often sung at the end of a gathering of friends **STORMY MONDAY** Blues standard written by T Bone Walker which first inspired BB King to take up electric guitar. Features Catherine's voice and Steve's harmonica at their best.

SLEEPLESS SAILOR Another moving song written and recorded by Kate Rusby.

THE ROSE A beautiful song made famous by Bette Midler who recorded it for the soundtrack to the film of the same name. More recently recorded by LeAnn Rimes and the Irish boy band Westlife.

THE TWO SISTERS A murder ballad that recounts the tale of a girl drowned by her sister

THE WATE? IS WIDE Also known as 'O Waly waly' - a Scottish folk song recorded by countless artists from Bob Dylan and Joan Baez through to Eva Cassidy and Mark Knopfler.

WILD MOUNTAIN THYME Also known as 'Will ye go lassie go'. A Scottish song about the hills (braes) around Balquhidder. Well known with countless recordings including James Taylor, Fotheringay, Rod Stewart, The Byrds, Thin Lizzy and many more

GAUDETE Steeleye Span classic

CATHERINE AND ELEANOR'S SONGS

AE FOND KISS Robbie Burns most recorded love song.

BLACK IS THE COLOUR A traditional folk song originating from Scotland recorded by almost everyone—Joan Baez, Christy Moore, Niamh Parsons, Sinead O'Connor, Brian McFadden and many more.

BLUE COCKADE A beautiful English folk song about a man who meets some soldiers, gets drunk and 'accidentally' enlists in the army.

BONNIE GEORGE CAMPBELL A Scottish ballad tells of a man who has gone off to fight but only his horse returns.

CARPICKFERGUS A well known nostalgic Irish folk song recorded by The Chieftains, The Dubliners, Bryan Ferry, Van Morrison, Ronan Keating and many more.

DIAMONDS AND RUST A 1970's song written and recorded by Joan Baez about her relationship with Bob Dylan

FIELDS OF ATHENRY Well known Irish Ballad written in the 1970's and set during the great Irish famine which has become an anthem for Irish sports supporters—notably the Munster rugby team amongst others FIELDS OF GOLD Originally written and recorded by Sting but perhaps made even more famous by Eva Cassidy

GREEN FIELDS OF FRANCE A modern folk song from 1976 made famous by Davy Arthur and The Fureys reflecting on the grave of a young man who died in WW1

JOHNNY 80Y A moving song written and performed by Gary Moore in memory of his friend and former Thin Lizzy colleague Phil Lynott.

LETTER TO SYRACUSE Anti-war protest song from USA.

LIGHT A LIGHT A 1974 song by Janis Ian from the Between the Lines album (famous for 'At Seventeen'). Great song.

MAID OF LLANWELLYN An 18th century song from Wales more recently recorded by Kate Rusby.

MATTY GROVES English folk ballad about an adulterous affair between the Lady of the Manor and one of her servants.

MORE TUNES

AIRS AND WALTZES

SIR JOHN FENWICK'S FLOWER AMANG THEM ALL Another Northumbrian pipe tune.

WILD ROSE OF THE MOUNTAIN / BATTLE OF

THE SOMME The first tune is a Scottish waltz. The second was written by Pipe major William Lawrie in WW1 whilst in hospital. He died of his wounds a few months later but lived long enough to see his tune adopted by every pipe band in the army.

YOUNG JANE A traditional English waltz

REELS

CIRCASSIAN CIRCLE Scottish tune for the dance of the same name

DONKEY RIDING / SALMON TAILS / CURLY HEADED PLOUGHBOY Three lively and popular tunes

FAIRY DANCE Another Scottish dance

JEAN CAMPBELL / REEL DU GOVERNMENT / OVER THE WATERFALL

MIARIS WEDDING Well known Scottish folk dance tune

WATERLOO DANCE English dance tune

JAMIE ALLEN/SALMON TAILS

ROXBOROUGH CASTLE/THE HESLEYSIDE One Scottish, one Northumbrian.

STEVE'S SONGS

SALLY WHEATLEY A Tyneside song by Joe Wilson which tells the story of heartbreak when Sally Wheatley goes off with another man—Mr Black.

BONNIE GATESHEAD LASS Another Joe Wilson song tells of a traumatic experience in The Bridge End at Gateshead but everything ends well when he gets a date with his Bonnie Gateshead Lass.

FATHOM THE BOWL An English drinking song originating from the 19C

TOCK OF THE SIDE A ballad from the Borders telling of a Border raid and the rescue of the imprisoned Jock of the Side.

THREE SCORE AND TEN The story of storms along the English east coast in 1889 and the loss of many fishing boats and lives. This song is still regularly performed today by the Filey fisherman's choir.

NINE TIMES A NIGHT A song all about a handsome young sailor who struggles to meets the sexual demands of his new bride

COMEDY SONGS

SEVEN DRUNKEN NIGHTS Well known Dubliners song. Caution, this version includes Saturday and Sunday which are normally omitted on broadcast versions.

After the watershed only!

MY GRANNY'S A CRIPPLE IN GLASGOW Granny and a host of other people fall off a cliff in an old seaside town far away. A Billy Connelly song.

ANOTHER IRISH DRINKING SONG. A 'mickey take' of the typical morbid folk song about death. In this song 'everybody dies'.

DELERIUM TREMENS A song by Christy Moore—the title says it all.

CHIPPY TEA A song about the great British fish and chip supper regularly performed in Burgh pub when it was run by the Hendren's

DRUNKEN SCOTSMAN A song concerned with the habit of failing to wear underwear beneath the kilt.

REAL ALE BLUES 12 Bar blues written for CAMRA.

SAVE OUR BEERS A Lindisfarne song protesting at the 'Fosterisation' of UK pubs

PUB OF THE YEAR 'We Love this Pub!' - A parody written to commemorate the first ever Pub of the Year award won by the Drovers.

THIS OLD PUB Another parody, this time based on the song This Old House (Shakin Stevens) originally written by a group of redundant miners from Mansfield. Tells the story of being barred for bad behaviour.

BOMBERS MOON A very moving antiwar song written by Mike Harding who never met his father—killed in action as a Bomber Command pilot in WW2

MORECAMBE BAY Folk song of the year a few years back. Remembers the Chinese cockle pickers tragedy.

ISLE OF HOPE Tells the story of Annie Moore, an Irish immigrant to USA.

HOME FROM THE SEA A lifeboat song performed by the Fisherman's Choirs
